Discussion Questions/ Curriculum for Tuxedo Baby and His Annoying Cousins These questions can be modified for kindergarten through 1<sup>st</sup> grade. Appropriated for 2<sup>nd</sup> through 4<sup>th</sup> grade.

- 1. Tux agrees that family is everything. What does that mean to you? (Tell a student to your right).
- 2. Which cousin is the one who takes charge? Do you have a bossy cousin? Tell us about that cousin.
- 3. There were 3 incidents that happened in the story. Can you recall what happened to Tux the  $1^{st}$ , the  $2^{nd}$ , and the  $3^{rd}$  time? (Wobbly fence, airport bathroom, and neighbor's orange tree)
- 4. Has a cousin or sibling ever led you into trouble when you were visiting or playing with them? Describe your trouble. What happened in the end? Tell a student on your left.
- 5. Do you agree with what happened to Tux after his cousins left? He had to go to bed without dinner, without dessert, and without finishing his homework. Let's take a hand vote in class and see if you agree or disagree.
- 6. Have you ever had a punishment like Tux? Can you share what you did? Or write in your journal.
- 7. The story ends with Tux thinking how he can avoid trouble next time his cousins visit. Can you help Tux with some ideas? (Remember, Tux is a good kid.) Put ideas on a chart as students raise their hands.
- 8. Can you come up with another story next time Tux has to be with his cousins using those ideas either in your journal or as a class story?
- 9. If you do a class story, assign 2 students each to illustrate a page. For example, if you have 24 students you should have 12 pages for this book. Each page can have 1-3 sentences or enough to illustrate an idea. This can

be a fun project for creativity, writing, teamwork, and art. Allow 1-2 weeks to complete. Enjoy!
